PRESIDENT’S MESSAGE

Summer Greetings Roseleigh Residents!

As we embark upon the summer let’s continue to make our neighborhood a great place to live! It is a perfect place to call home whether you are a family with young children, a young couple buying your first home, or empty nesters. Let’s continue to be caring, understanding, appreciative and look out for our residents.

OUR RESIDENTIAL LATEST ACCOMPLISHMET-SKYCOP CAMERAS!

Since June 2018, we started to look into security solutions utilizing technology to achieve the highest level of security. We partnered with Skycop. Skycop is monitored by MPD Real Time Crime Control Center. Skycop monitors within the Center have been installed since October 2015. There are 3 camera units (Belgrave, Holly Heath & Roseleigh Lane). Each camera has licensed plate readers (LPR). LPRs are special purpose cameras that automatically capture all license plate numbers that come into view, along with the location, date, and time. The data, which includes photographs of the vehicle and sometimes its driver and passengers, is then uploaded to a central server. MPD will handle all warranty claims.
